VIRGINIA’S GAS PRICES CLIMB 35 CENTS IN 30 DAYS

VIRGINIA BEACH, VA (Monday, February 18, 2013) – Gas prices have soared 35 cents in the past 30 days in the Commonwealth, forcing Virginia motorists to shell out more and more of their hard earned money to fill their gas tanks. In fact, prices went up a whopping 11 cents per gallon since Friday in Virginia and currently average \$3.61 for a gallon of self-serve regular gasoline.

The high prices motorists are seeing at the pump are a function of the age-old tension between supply and demand, and strangely enough, both are down now. Crude oil supplies are also down in the wake of OPEC’s decision several months ago to lower production by nearly one million barrels per day. Now, the cost of crude oil has sky-rocketed, causing gas at the pumps to soar.

American motorists are now spending in the neighborhood of \$1.3 billion per day to fill their gas tanks. The average household spent \$2,912 for gasoline in 2012, which makes up almost 4 percent of pre-tax income, according to the U.S. Department of Energy. That figure ties 2008 for the highest percentage in roughly 30 years.

“In essence, for each 50 cent increase in the price at the pump, motorists will approximately spend \$600 more per year,” said Georjeane Blumling, Vice President of Public Affairs. “These rapidly rising gas prices are especially tough on people already trying to do more with less. Fuel conservation is becoming critical for people trying to balance a family budget.”
